Michel Henry and the Phenomenology of Life

Faculdade de Filosofia e Ciências Sociais, Universidade Católica Portuguesa, Portugal

1) Brief description of the Course (Course Goals and Objectives)	Published posthumously in 2002, in the year of his death, "Words of Christ" shows us how the radical phenomenology developed by Michel Henry allows us to understand the way God manifests himself. Leaving aside the ontotheological affirmation of God's existence, as well as the definition of the divine essence, Henry seeks to answer the following question: "Is it possible for man to hear in his own language a word that speaks in another language", that of God? In this context, we propose to read this work, as well as excerpts from "I am the Truth" and "Incarnation," in order to expose the essence of Michel Henry's phenomenology and his understanding of Christology.

5) Comments	Methodology: With the goal of reading "Words of Christ," as well as excerpts from "I am the Truth" and "Incarnation," in order to understand the fundamental insights of the phenomenology of life that Michel Henry proposes, this workshop will begin with a brief exposition of the Henryian approach. We will discuss around questions proposed in advance about the chapters to be analyzed in each session. Each student will be asked to participate in the discussion, which will allow us to enter the text, Henry's phenomenology and the intellectual context to which it responds. Ideally, the chapters (from the book Words of Christ), scheduled for each session, should be read in advance. Students will be required to write an essay (between 5,000 and 7,000 characters, including spaces) that will be evaluated.

Church and the State: Concepts of mutual relationship and Christian approaches to a pluralistic society

Philosophisch-Theologische Hochschule Sankt Georgen, Germany

1) Brief description of the Course (Course Goals and Objectives)	Starting from the origins of Christianity, the relationship between “Church” and “State” was never undisputed. This applies even regarding the fact that in history “Church” as well as “State” were changing realities. Nowadays, in public administration and politics the question of introducing universally acceptable values is at stake. To what extent should Christians introduce their positions on birth control, abortion, gender issues, homosexuality (same sex marriage), assisted suicide etc. in public debates? To what extent should they claim to implement their values in public law? What is the appropriate Christian attitude towards a State that embraces adherents of diverse ideologies and religions? Can Christians accept secularity as an encompassing social concept to safeguard peace and harmony in a multifaceted society? What is the meaning of secularity – in particular with regard to the currently much debated concept of “multiple secularities”? The seminar deals with such questions. It presents path breaking concepts of the relationship between “Church” and “State” of Western history. Furthermore, it discusses modern proposals to conceive and form the relationship between religious communities – including the Church – and a pluralistic society... Contemporary Moral and Political Philosophy

1) Brief description of the Course (Course Goals and Objectives)	This course enables students to understand and master the issues and fundamental ethical concepts that characterize the question of social justice. We examine Rawls's conception of justice and the principles, according to which the distribution of rights, liberties income and wealth should take place. We scrutinize the Rawlsian conception of justice as a response to utilitarianism, based on the Kantian method aimed at proposing universal principles. We also evoke the criticism of Gerald Cohen which is based on the conceptual analysis of the principles thus making a return to the Platonic method which consists in questioning the concept of justice and in revealing its nature necessary. Finally we consider the communitarian critique of Rawlsian liberalism with Michael Sandel.

Starting with early analytical philosophy (Frege, Russell, Moore, logicism), as well as the logical positivism of the Vienna Circle, it proceeds to examine the development of Wittgenstein's thinking from his Tractatus to the Investigations and On Certainty. It then considers other related developments in mainstream analytical philosophy of language, epistemology and philosophy of mind (Quine, Sellars, Davidson, Strawson, Lewis and McDowell), together with related issues arising in contemporary approaches to metaphysical realism.

Selected Aspects of the Literature of the English-Speaking Countries

1) Brief description of the Course (Course Goals and Objectives)	The aim of the course is to examine selected aspects of the literature of English speaking countries based on certain representative texts. The texts will be examined in the context of the literary genres to which they belong, and which imply a particular worldview. The classes will help the students to uncover the deeper, hidden meanings that can be found in the symbols and other means of expression used by the selected writers in their works. An added value of the course will be a discussion of issues related to the reception of the selected works, i.e. the publishing practice of the period in which they were composed, the impact of the texts on later writers, and the new trends which they gave rise to.
